Studies have found that chess helps improve test results in reading, science, and math, and produces growth in critical cognitive skills. Beyond academia, chess influences social behavior including self-esteem, respect for others, patience, and good sportsmanship. And did we mention it's FUN!

The Berkeley Chess School holds scholastic Quad tournaments at their chess center in Berkeley once a month all year round and once a month in San Ramon during the school year. All of our tournaments are USCF (United States Chess Federation) rated. All participants must have a current USCF membership. The basic membership for kids under 18 is \$20 for one year. Math Champions Grades K-6

(Minimum 4 students/Maximum 10 students)

These workshops are for students with strong math skills who want to pursue excellence in math in fun-filled and interesting ways. Math Champions for Winter 2025 will be segmented into three parts – math worksheets, individual mental math quizzing, and Math Kangaroo word problems.

Most math subjects covered in common core are addressed, but problem areas will receive more attention. Math Kangaroo competition test problems and other word problems are the foundation for this workshop. The focus is on methods of analysis, critical thinking, and having fun with math rather than on "math drills".

Students are strongly encouraged to sign up for the International Math Kangaroo competition in March 2025 with enrollment starting on September 15, 2024. Click here for more details.

- **Grade K:** beginning addition; subtraction; division into equal groups; and multiplication (or skip counting), using simple numbers and tens, In the teaching process, I will include lots of fun games, like counting dots on dice and simple work problems, with small rewards given for mastery.
- <u>Grade 1:</u> skip counting digits 1-5; subtraction of single digits; introduction to simple multiplication; division
 into equal parts; easy problems that develop observation and reasoning skills, including addition and
 subtraction with carrying and regrouping
- **Grade 2:** skip counting digits 1-9; simple subtraction, 1-2 digits; multiplication tables 1-5 then 5-10; mental multiplication using powers; work problems from previous year's Math Kangaroo National Test competitions; introduction to fractions, percent, and basic geometry problems.
- <u>Grade 3:</u> 2-and 3-digit addition and subtraction; multiplication tables out to 12; multiplication using powers, easy division without remainders; box multiplication and basic beginning algebra.
- **Grade 4:** working with fractions; multiplication tables to 15; geometry problems with area and perimeter; introduction to angles and shapes; multiplication and division of 2-3-digit numbers using basic algebra.
- Grade 5 and Grade 6: more advanced elementary math based on interest and skill levels.

Public Speaking Grades 1-5

(Minimum 7 students/Maximum 10 students)

Pre-Public Speaking (Grades 1-2): This course teaches first through second graders the beginning building blocks of public speaking. Starting with being ready, practiced, and focused, they will learn the importance of body language and varying the tempo and tone of their voice. They will also learn the value of good openings and closings. Within the fun milieu of the show and tell, storytelling, and poetry recitals, the goal is for your child to start developing more confidence and skill in expressing themselves to a group.

Public Speaking and Debate Combo (Grades 3-5): This class focuses on teaching delivery and presentation skills to the students. Students learn how to manage public speaking anxiety, present themselves with confidence, and connect with their audience through effective body language. It improves their confidence in public speaking and communication skills. They learn different approaches to preparing for a speech, for example speaking from notes or from memory. The students learn how to make strong arguments, use tools like flow, and practice note-taking. This course instills critical thinking in students by providing reasoning and evidence. This course introduces various formats of debates popular in high school. The participants debate on a variety of age-appropriate topics in various formats.
